to me since you weren't there.

Congress & a huge success -
Still, nothing will come up

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to Basel & held ^{several} meetings with Anna Lidemann's help. I've attended several. The head of the police at Bern went to the meeting, & when I visited him next day with my passport, as one has to do continually, he was all smiles & courtesy. - I had had a long attack of influenza before I left home & I didn't enjoy the Congress very much in consequence - but it did me no end of good - I am quite well - My visit to Germany was wonderful. I went because I felt inside me

I must go. I wanted to
see ^{how} things were & because I
want to help, — (such amount,
as if I could! — but you
won't misunderstand I know
& think I felt any such foolish-
ness,) to bring a better
feeling. The kindness I showed
over welcomed me — As soon
as anyone, travelling anywhere,
trains — trams — streets, knew
I was English they were so
good & kind. I went to
Frankfurt — where the station
is terrible to Munich —
The bread is very very trying —
& though we get food at the

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hours, it makes one thin!
I feel how serious the
financial position of Germany is
in its effect upon our trade -
U. S. A. is everywhere getting
all the trade, since they
can advance money to the
German traders - I saw no
English - This like a wonderful
dream now.

Your kind words dear
dear Willie touch me so much.
I kept feeling as if Bessie's
thoughts were with me, in
Germany it helped me - But
I wonder if the pain of
bereavement ever leaves me.

But I am ^{very} ^{much} ^{working}
for it is the happiest thing left.
I am perhaps to go to Sartzaland
again next spring for a town
of W. Suff. meetings - to
formany also - when we meet
there is much to tell you -
Evelyn had a splendid time
in Serbia & has received from
the Crown Prince the order
of S. Salvator - It is a lovely
thing & I want her to wear
it all day! She deserved
it for she has saved & looked
for Serbians - And for Belgians
too - she had a real time
there too amidst grateful families.
