into some sort of order.

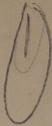

tell Sembeau that I

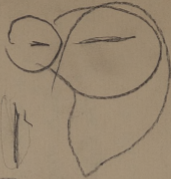
was expecting him all

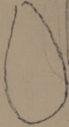

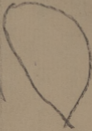
