Passing through Brussels I saw in a shop window the painting of a Crucifixion, very beautifully executed, only it was a draped woman on the cross, and the treatment suggestive of everything ~~that was~~ good. Beneath the painting appeared the words in Flemish "I am crucified with CHRIST". At first sight I regarded the thing as at least bordering on the blasphemous, but I soon altered my mind realizing the wrongs borne by women, and the deep underlying truths. It is unnecessary for me to say more now.
