It has been reported to me since my release from Wandsworth Prison that the H.W.S.S. Council have endorsed the generous action of the Executive, permitting Mr Towler to do my work while I am away from Bristol. May I say how deeply I appreciate their action & also that of yourself. I can understand how keenly you must feel on the great war question - as keenly as I feel in the opposite direction. That only emphasises the breadth & generosity of the spirit behind your action. To me it is full of profound import for the success of the women's movement & I trust the time is not far distant when I shall be able once again to do my little towards its complete achievement.
