This Meeting is of a unique character as it has never been attempted before to fill a central London Hall with bona fide working women who desire their enfranchisement. The household cares of the women make such a meeting difficult, but the response to our invitation has far exceeded our expectation. Plaistow alone is sending nearly 200, and numerous bodies of 50 upwards are coming from the poorer districts in North, South & East London (for whom reserved stalls are being provided as well as many individual women, charwomen, housewives and others.

Suffrage songs and choruses composed by Lady Strachey will be sung to popular tunes while the audience is being seated.
