how I should get news through

The prisoners & suppettes are
not allowed to take the com-
munion unless they repent - So
there have been great scenes at
the Chaplains refusal to see another
Suppette, So "Mother Darling"
the round faced Cenote
had to interview all the
Church Ladies

Goodbye my dear I
am quite well & joyfully
I have not received a parcel
yet I saw a story about them

Dearest Everybody,

Thank you very much for your letters read to me by

Mr Hankinson.

I am quite well but I have had headaches which I think were caused by a gathering on a tooth. So the Doctor put me in Hospital where everything is very comfortable. It is ^{not} within the power of the Doctor to allow us food from outside as the Home Secretary forbids. So he sends those into Hospital who he thinks need it when he can't order what he likes. I shall always feel grateful to him for his kindness. There is one girl here who exercises with the ordinary prisoners. So I shall give this note to her to give to someone who has a visitor. I must not write it long as there are so many to pass through. Love to all my precious sister
