

also, that no democratic movement can ask for men anything less than manhood suffrage, and for women ~~nothing~~ <sup>anything</sup>, less than is granted to men. It would also be helpful if you would make clear that as the tendency of Parliamentary legislation is to deal more and more directly and intimately with matters affecting the home life as well as the industrial life of the community, and also with matters deeply affecting the conditions of child life, it is of the greatest importance that women, who are thus becoming more and more affected by such legislation, should have an equal right with men <sup>to</sup> and take an active part in the political life of the country.
