I work in regiment is 7<sup>th</sup> York  
Rangers. They are at the  
front. I had a letter from  
him dated April 12<sup>th</sup> m

When he said he was about  
a mile from the front, in  
a way hanging about, for  
a ~~street~~ or an hour comes that  
the C.O. & 2<sup>d</sup> in command  
are never to be at the  
front together, so he has to  
be a little in the rear, but  
close at hand so as to take  
control of the C.O. at the  
knock or want a rest.  
Cui pro te deince heat week.  
I hope you are well & fat  
sure you are busily scanted  
at war. I saw Tom Morris here  
the other day looking very  
well. Your aff! cousin
