My Dear Bishop,

The meeting organised by the Church League for Women's Suffrage over which I had the pleasure of presiding at the Church House on Saturday afternoon was largely attended, and the following resolution was carried enthusiastically with two dissentients :--

- That this meeting welcomes the statement of the aims of the Women's Movement adopted by the Central Council of the National Mission in July, 1916, and urges upon the Church the necessity of putting into practice the resolutions following therefrom, which were passed by the Council :--
 - (a) By throwing open to Churchwomen all opportunities for service now enjoyed by laymen, and
 - (b) By impressing upon clergy and laity the duty of considering the Women's Movement " in the light of the principles of Christianity."

In forwarding it to you may I express the hope, which was expressed by all the speakers, that the whole question may soon be brought before the Bishops.
