I received your letter on my return from the Country where I had been spending a few days to recruit my health after the fatigue & harass of the exhibition. I send you a list of the pictures returned, also those sold, if there is any slight error in the percentage I will give it when I send you over the money for the carriage of the pictures. I have had them properly packed but in coming the "servante de Basse Normandie" had a hole completely through and in this state I sold it but we must have it repaired which will cost 2 g's. There also were slightly damaged - but in this a nail had gone quite through.

If we have pictures another year
They must not be those that
have been exhibited in England
nor lithographed and not
such heavy ones as the two
large ones the carriage being so
enormous. I am afraid that
I shall not be in Paris before
the Autumn at any rate and
then perhaps I may go that way
to Dresden. I forward you
a catalogue should have done
so before but thought that you
had one as I desired my lady
assistant to forward you
one - Considering all things
we have had a very exhibition.
