Dear Madam

I am very sorry in clearing up my papers before leaving for my holiday to find that I quite forgot to write to inform you of the result of my communications with Miss McArthur on the subject of the interview in the Daily News to which you kindly drew my attention. I hope however that you yourself saw her contradiction of the words attributed to her to the effect that she objected to the association of the Suffrage Movement with the Cause of Women's Labour. I am happy to say that she had already caused the correction to be inserted in the paper before I had been able to communicate with her about it. It is of course a fact that Miss McArthur's opinions upon the ~~restrictions~~ of women's labour differ from those held by many of us. The official opinion of this Society is that it is an injustice to legislate in regard to women's labour without permitting them a voice in the matter.

I hope you will forgive my long delay in answering your letter.
