Com<sup>tee</sup>. are arranging a meeting in  
London on Tuesday October 3<sup>rd</sup> to  
protest against the Amendment to the Coal  
Mines Bill, which will exclude  
women from work at the Pithead;  
& to demand the Franchise for women.  
There is a ~~good~~ chance that the  
Amendment may be cut out of the Bill  
at the Report stage, but there are various  
real dangers to be met, which make  
it important that every available effort

must be made. As you know Mr  
Walter MacLaren has in the past taken  
a prominent part in this agitation & he  
is doing all he can now. but unfortunately  
he will be abroad when the Bill comes  
on. Would you com<sup>te</sup> help in selling  
tickets do you think & in bringing  
people to this meeting. The Pithon  
deputation to the Home Office will be  
present & a Pithon worker will speak.  
I expect to be in Manchester this week
