When I was in town lately, I saw
Miss Emily Davies, & told her that

I thought it would be very advantageous if I were to join the Ladies Club here, as then our Committee could always meet there, it would bring me in contact with a good many people, & it would give me if a member, what is very necessary for my work, a permanent address in Brighton.
