I received your letter

is that I am still very weak

and seeing so many visitors
- both of Miss B. Carter's and
my own - as I have done these
last few days, this one very
much. It is far more of an
excursion than to go about or even
walk, as I have done to-day for
a little while in the ^{of} Hemmington-
Gardens, by the side of my Bath-
chair. The doctor has fixed our
departure for Saturday or

Monday, and it so chances that
~~on~~ ^{for} Friday I expect Miss
Crickman, Miss Luccian and
Mrs. Petrus to see me, one after
the other. Besides Miss B. Carter
generally has some one coming
in for tea or dinner, and as I
regularly sit up at meals now,
it is always company for me
too. So my sister thinks it would
be decidedly too much for me if

I saw you too on Friday.

The Doctor is very well satisfied with the progress of my cheek and I hardly cough at all now, also ^{am} filling out again in the face, but somehow I cannot get my strength up.

To night Miss Kennedy is coming in to dinner to see me. Yesterday my sister was at a political meeting with Miss B. Carter and two Irish ladies who addressed the audience (English workmen) on or rather against Home Rule. You can imagine

that it shocked and amused my
sister very much, being on account
of an almost incredible thing
for her conservative and German
spirit. Mrs. Peterson came in too
and spoke violently for Thomas
Pugh.

Excuse this scrap of paper, but
my note paper is getting to
an end and I am writing up this
in my room with no resources
to apply to. I am glad to hear a
