THIS REPORT on the Linoleum, Leathercloth and Allied Trades relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of linoleum, felt base, leathercloth, oilcloth, oil baize, leatherette, etc.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 191 in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Any establishments in Northern Ireland are excluded in 1948; no production was recorded there in this trade for 1937 or 1935.
