THIS REPORT on the Watch and Clock Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of watches and clocks (including electric clocks), and in the repair of watches and clocks if done for the trade, but not if done directly for the public. Government establishments are included for post-war years.
