THIS REPORT on the Manufactured Stationery, Paper Bag and Kindred Industries relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of paper bags, stationery of all kinds made from paper or cardboard, index cards, cardboard files and other (unprinted) articles of paper, cardboard or transparent cellulose wrappings, except boxes or cartons.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 183 in the Standard Industrial Classification.
