## IOYS AND GAMES TRAD

THIS REPORT on the Toys and Games Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of children's toys of all kinds (except rubber toys) and indoor games including chess and draughts sets, but excluding playing cards.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 193(1) in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Any establishments in Northern Ireland are excluded in 1948; no production was recorded there in this trade for 1937 or 1935.
