This Report on the Furniture and Upholstery Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing wooden or upholstered domestic, office, school, church, theatre and cinema furniture, wooden radio and television cabinets, billiard tables, upholstered seats for public service vehicles, basket furniture, etc. Upholstered seats for cars and commercial vehicles, aircraft passenger seats, and metal furniture and rustic furniture are excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 472 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 census.

The industry corresponds to the Furniture and Upholstery Industry (Part 109) in the reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, except that upholstered seats for cars and commercial vehicles and aircraft passenger seats, formerly included in this industry, are now included in the 1968 reports on the Motor Vehicle Manufacturing Industry (Part 82) and the Aerospace Equipment Manufacturing and Repairing Industry (Part 84) respectively.

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

For 1963, in this industry, where small establishments account for a relatively large proportion of employment and output, establishments employing fewer than twenty-five persons were asked to complete a simplified version of the full census form. For 1968 similar information was not collected from small firms in this industry.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
