## TOOL AND IMPLEMENT TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Tool and Implement Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of hand tools and implements, and electric portable power tools: engineers small tools are excluded. Government establishments are included in each year from 1948 onwards

This trade corresponds to minimum Iist heading $90(1)$ in the Standard Industrial Classification.
