LEATHER GOODS

THIS REPORT on the Leather Goods Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of trunks, suitcases, handbags, pocket books, belts, straps, harness saddlery and other goods (except clothing) of leather and leather substitutes.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 131 in the Standard Industrial Classification.

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IMPORTANT NOTES and definitions appear on the next page. In interpreting the data in the tables, it is essential to bear these in mind.

ied to industries according to the nature of their out

 industries, the principal products for a given industry
being of a similar nature or comondy associated in pro-
duction. The principle of classification normally followed is that an ostablishment is classified to an
industry if its output of the principal product of that industry accounted for a qreater proportion of the value
of its output than did its output of the principal pro-
ducts of any other industry. Specialist producers no rmally comprise those establish-
ments 50 per cent or more of whose otal output by ments 50 per cent. or more of whose total output
value is accounted for by the characteristic products the specialist group.
Intermediate products:
given showing the total industries figures are
quantities made during the year of interediate products. i.e. products which may be
further processed in the estabiishments in which they further proce
are produced.
Larger establishments: The information qiven in the report relates mainly to 'larger establishments, i.e.
estabishments of firms employing on the average more than 10 persons. In most cases an establivhment comprises the whole of the premises under the same owner-
ship or managenent at carticular addreas (o.9. a mine
or factory). offices, warehouses. laboratories and other anililary places of theniness situated apart from
