This Report on the Coal Mining Industry relates to establishments of the National Coal Board and non-nationalised undertakings in Great Britain engaged in the extraction of coal from deep mines and quarries and in such ancillary activities of cleaning, washing, grading, etc, normally carried out at mines. Persons associated with coal production employed by the National Coal Board elsewhere than at the mines (ie by Area Boards and in Divisional and Headquarters offices), and their remuneration are in general included, but certain administrative staff associated mainly with activities other than coal production are excluded from this report.

The extraction of coal from opencast workings so far as recorded separately is excluded and classified to Construction.

Mining and Quarrying Industries were excluded from the censuses for 1963 and 1968 taken in Northern Ireland and this report relates, therefore, only to Great Britain.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 101 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 2).

The figures have been compiled from returns made to the Ministry of Power. The figures for 1963 relate to the calendar year and those for 1968 relate to the 52 weeks ended 29 March, 1969.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
