5 Metalliferous mining and quarrying

This Report on the Metalliferous Mining and Quarrying Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in mining and quarrying iron ore and ironstone, lead, tin and other non-ferrous metals or metalliferous ores and in such ancillary activities as cleaning, washing, grading, etc, normally carried out at pits and quarries.

This industry corresponds to minimum list headings 109(1) and 109(2) in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 5).

Mining and quarrying industries were excluded from the censuses for 1963 and 1968 taken in Northern Ireland and this report relates, therefore, only to Great Britain.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
