THIS REPORT on the Manufactured Stationery, Paper Bag and Kindred Trades relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manu facture of paper bags, stationery of al finds made from paper or cardboard, index cards, cardbard
files and other (unprinted) articles of paper, cardboard or transparent cellulose wrappings, except boxes or cartons.
These trades correspond to minimum list heading 183 in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Any establishments in Northern Ireland are excluded in 1948 ; no production was recorded there in these trades for
