The Report on the Census of Production for 1958 Part 5 50 MISCELLANEOUS (NON-ELECTRICAL) MACHINERY

This report on the Miscellameous (Non-electrical) Machinery Industry relates to establishments engaged in the manufacture of boring and cutting machinery, underground conveyors, screening, washing and other machinery for mines; type-setting and composing room equipment, printing presses, paper bag, envelope and paper goods making machinery; refrigerating machinery and all types of refrigerators (including domestic); equipment for space heating, ventilating and air-conditioning systems and dust extraction systems, including heater batteries, unit heaters, ventilators, hoods,
cowls, ducting, etc. self fcontained air-conditioning machines (but not thermostats and similar cowls, ducting, etc., self-contained air-conditioning machines (but not thermostats and similar conditioning etc. equipment which are excluded as indicated below) ; pumps, industrial valves, air and gas compressors and exhausters, pneumatic control equipment and hydraulic accumulators and rams; scales, spring balances, weighing machinery, etc.: portable power tools of the hand held type (including flexible shaft drive tools) and of the type employed in civil engineering, mining and quarrying, boot and shoe machinery, bottling and packaging machinery, food and drink machinery, working machinery, sewing machines (including domestic), rolling mills, wood-working machinery, fire extinguishing apparatus and other complete machines not reported on elsewhere. The industry corresponds to minimum list heading 339 of the second (1958) edition of the Standard Industrial Classification, which has been used for the first time in the 1958 Census

Most of the machinery included in this report was reported on in Industry 4I (Mechanical printing and book-binding machinery, formerly the subject of a separate industry report, 4H, and electrical portable power tools, formerly reported on in Industry 5A (Tool and Implement) are now included in this industry.

Thermostats and similar measuring and control apparatus for heating equipment form part of inimum list heading 351 and are included in the report on Scientific. Surgical and Photographic instruments, etc. (Part For 1958, retal were required only from firms employing twenty-five or more persons and most of the tables in this report relate only to these larger firms. This is an mportant change from previous censuses when returns in full detail were required from firms mploying eleven or more persons an produre The figures
for 1954 correspond as closely as possible to those collected for 1958 but information. Some other chang, especially in respect of the small firms who gave only limited information. Some other changes introduced in the 1958 Census also affect the co
between 1954 and 1958 figures; these are explained in the notes prefacing this report.

## TREATMENT OF PARTS

In the 1958 Census reports for this and other mechanical engineering industries, a distinction is made between parts sold in association with the sale of complete machines, and other parts sold. The only parts shown in Table 4 are those included on returns (whether classified to this or to other industries) which also showed sales of miscellaneous (non-electrical) machinery; where return was classified to another industry, these parts are also shown together with the

Parts of miscellaneous (non-electrical) machinery included on returns which showed no sales of the complete machines are treated as principal products of General Mechanical Engineering (Part 53 ) whether made by engineering firms or by specialist manufacturers of other types of machinery.
Sales

Sales of all parts of miscellaneous (non-electrical) machinery (i.e. whether or not sold in association with the sale of complete machines) are brought together in Table 9 at the end of this report.

This industry is defined in terms of its 'principal products' which are those shown in
Table 4. A census return was classified to this industry if the sales of the principal products Table 4. A census return was classified to this industry if the sales of the principal products
of this industry (excluding parts, etc. as mentioned below) accounted for a greater proportion of of this industry (excluding parts, etc. as mentioned below) accounted for a greater proportion of
its output than the principal products of any other industry (with corresponding exclusions). Where, however, the application of this rule would have resulted in a change of classification between 1954 (on the revised basis) and 1958, the return was classified to the same industry as for 1954 unless the output of principal products in the new industry was one third more than in the old; this modification of the general rule was designed to avoid discontinuities as the result
of marginal changes of output between the two censuses. The rule was also modified in the case of returns with amounts totalling 50 per cent. or more at structural work headings, which include the value of materials supplied, or 80 per cent. or more at headings for installation work on, or sales of, air-conditioning, heating and ventilating plant (or a proportionate combination of these two groups of headings); these returns were classified to the Construction Industry (Part 128 ).
Sales of machinery parts, work done (other than structural and installation work), including Sales of machinery parts, work done (other than structural and installation work), including repair work, were not taken into account in classifying returns except in cases where they
exceeded 80 per cent. of the total output of the return (in which case the return was classified to the General Mechanical Engineering Industry (Part 53)) or where the return mould otherwise have been classified outside the mechanical engineering group of industries.

In cases where the application of these rules would have resulted in the classification of a return to one of the mechanical engineering industries relating to a specific class of machinery (viz., Parts $42,43,45,46,47,48,49$ and 51 ) and the sales of the principal products of the industry concerned accounted for less than 20 per cent. of the total sales and work done, the return was classified to this industry. Sales of merchanted products and of non-specific items such as waste products and canteen takings were not taken into account in classifying returns.
A procedure similar to that described above for classifying to the industry was followed in A procedure similar to that described above for classifying to the industry was followed in
assifying to the sub-divisions of the industry shown in Table 2, the sub-divisions being defined classifying to the sub-divisions of the industry shown in Table 2 , the sub-divisions being defined
in terms of their 'characteristic products'. The numbers shown in the left hand column of Table 4 identify the sub-division of which the item is a characteristic product. The total value of sales of characteristic products shown in Table 2 includes, besides the sales of complete machines, which were taken into account in determining the classification of the return, sales of parts of classified to the sub-division: but these items were not taken into account in determining the classification to sub-divisions.
