148 Miscellaneous stationers' goods

This Report on the Miscellaneous Stationers' Goods Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing fountain pens and nibs, ballpoint pens and refills, felt and fibre tipped pens, pencils, chalks, crayons and pastels; rubber and date stamps and accessories, office machinery requisites, staplers, pencil sharpeners, writing and duplicating ink.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 495 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 123).

There were no larger establishments in this industry in Northern Ireland in 1963 and 1968.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
