This Report on the Gas Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the production and distribution of gas for public supply. Construction work carried out by employees of gas undertakings is included. Showrooms are also included. Establishments (other than transport undertakings) producing gas primarily for their own use are excluded, being included in the industries covering the major output of the parent works.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 601 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 127).

This report covers all undertakings of the twelve Area Gas Boards together with the Gas Council, and gas undertakings in Northern Ireland. The figures for 1968 relate to the year ending 29 March 1969, and those for 1963 to the year ending 31 March 1964.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
