## RUBBER TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Rubber Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of solid and pneumatic tyres of all types, inner tubes, sheet rubber, sponge rubber, rubber tubing and hose, balata belting, rubber footwear, gloves, bathing caps, toys, balls flooring and tiling, etc. Goods made from synthetic rubber are included, but the manufacture of synthetic rubber itself is excluded.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 190 in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Any establishments in Northern Ireland are excluded in 1948; no production was recorded there in this trade for 1937 or 1935.
