THIS REPORT on the Hardware, Hollow-ware, Metal Furniture and Sheet Metal Industry relates to stablishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of a large variety of finished metal goods establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of a large variety of furniture, metal including domestic door frames, safes, locks, latches and keys. Most of the products proper to this industry are made of iron and steel, but in some cases non-ferrous metals form the main or sole materials; goods wholly of brass are, however, generally excluded.

Owing to the increasing proportion of gas appliances made from sheet steel instead of from cast ron, a number of establishments classified to the Iron Foundries Industry (Volume 3 Industry C) for 1948 and 1951 were re-classified for 1954 to this industry. In 1951 these establishments employed 9,024 persons and had a net output of $£ 6,291,000$.

This industry corresponds to minimum list headings 94 and $99(1,2,3$ and 7$)$ in the Standard Industrial Classification.
