## THE LINEN AND HEMP TRADES INTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises firms that were engaged wholly or mainly in the spinning and weaving of flax and hemp, including the making-up of linen and hemp goods. The output of firms engaged in the making-up of canvas goods and sacks from purchased fabric is dealt with in the report on the Canvas Goods and Sack Trade (see page 248), and the output of hard hemp yarn in the report on the Rope, Twine and Net Trade (see page 226).

The returns for the Irish Linen Trade were made on a departmental basis, transfers of materials from one department (e.g. spinning) to another in the same factory (e.g. thread-making or weaving) being treated as sales and purchases, respectively; for factories in Great Britain, the goods manufactured were valued only at the stage at which they were sold or remained in stock at the end of the year. In view of these differences in method, figures for Great Britain and for Northern Ireland are shown separately.
