#### GRAIN MILLING TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Grain Milling Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the milling of wheat (including the production of self-raising and patent flour at milling establishments), in the milling, flaking, or rolling of barley, oats, rye, rice, etc., in splitting or grinding peas, beans, lentils, soya beans, sago, tapioca, in manufacturing ready-to-eat breakfast cereals such as cornflakes or puffed or shredded wheat, or in making peat or peat moss litter.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 150 and part of heading 199 (3) in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Establishments in this trade in Northern Ireland (which are excluded in 1948) accounted in 1935 for about 3 per cent. of the net output for the United Kingdom.

Throughout this report the cost of materials for 1948 is shown after deduction of the amount of interim rebates (about £57,800,000) allowed by the Ministry of Food from the cost of wheat purchased. Other allowances are payable by the Ministry after the end of the year which are estimated to be less than 5 per cent. of the amount of the interim rebates. The value of the output shown for 1937 and 1935 excludes the amount of quota payments made to the Wheat Commission in respect of wheat meal and flour produced in those years, amounting to about £735,000 in 1937 and £6,264,000 in 1935.
