## THE COIR FIBRE, HORSE-HAIR AND FEATHER TRADES <br> INTRODUCTORY

The trades included in this report are (a) the manufacture of coir mats and matting, (b) the cleaning and dressing of horse-hair and the manufacture of horse-hair fabric, (c) the cleaning and dressing of fibres and bristles and ( $d$ ) the cleaning and dressing of feathers or down. These trades are carried on, as a rule, independently of each other, but in view of their small extent they were grouped together in the in view of their small extent they were grouped together in the
Census classification; separate aggregate figures for each trade for the years 1935 and I930 are, however, given in Table IV
Philanthropic institutions were not required to make returns in respect of the work done by their inmates and patients. It is understood that a considerable output of goods, particularly of coir mats and matting, thereby escaped record.
The figures for 1933 and 1934 are deficient in relation to those of other years by reason of the omission of certain firms, particulars of whose output in 1935 are given in a footnote to Table V A. The value of the gross output of these firms in 1935 was $£_{2} 267,000$, the net output $£ 78,000$ and the number of persons employed 4 I 3 .
