## 101 <br> Woollen and worsted

This Report on the Woollen and Worsted Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in sorting, cleaning, blending, etc and combing virgin wool and fine animal hair and making tops (including tops of man-made fibre) and carded sliver, converting tow to tops without combing; processing of laps and noils and other soft waste; spinning of yarns on the worsted systems and weaving worsted fabrics of such yarns; spinning woollen yarn on the woollen system, weaving woollen fabric of such yarns and making-up blankets, travelling rugs, etc of woollen yarns; manufacturing mungo and shoddy from woollen and worsted fabric waste and processing hard waste for use in woollen spinning; weaving wool felt and manufacturing pressed felt of wool or hair. The weaving of narrow fabrics and the manufacture of needleloom felt are excluded.
This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 414 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as "a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.
The industry corresponds to the Woollen and Worsted Industry (Part 78) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 except that the sorting and cleaning of woollen, worsted and hair rags and waste formerly shown in this industry are now out of scope of the Census.
Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

## TREATMENT OF FABRICS BACKED WITH PLASTIC FOAM AND FABRIC TO FABRIC BONDED MATERIALS

Fabrics backed with plastic foam and fabric to fabric bonded materials are shown as principal products of the same industry as the main fabric rather than the material used for the backing or bonding. Thus, knitted fabrics backed with plastic foam and knitted fabric to fabric bonded materials are shown in Table 5 of the report on the Hosiery and Other Knitted Goods Industry (Part 104), and the corresponding table of this report and the report on the Weaving of Cotton, Linen and Man-made Fibres Industry (Part 100) show respectively sales of woollen or worsted fabrics backed with plastic foam and woollen and worsted fabric to fabric bonded materials; and sales of cotton fabrics backed with plastic foam and cotton fabric to fabric bonded materials. Total sales of all fabrics backed with plastic foam, fabric to fabric bonded materials and finished cloth of cotton, linen and man-made fibres, reported in the census, together with those reported by merchant convertors in a separate inquiry, are brought together in a supplement to Table 5 in the report on the Weaving of Cotton, Linen and man-made Fibres Industry (Part 100).
Sales of fabrics backed with plastic foam and fabric to fabric bonded materials were not taken into account in classifying returns to the three textile industries in which they are shown.
The foambacking of fabric on commission and fabric to fabric bonding on commission were classified to the Textile Finishing Industry (Part 110).

## METHOD OF CLASSIFICATION

The classification of returns to this industry followed the standard procedure as outlined in the notes on page (i) except for the special treatment of fabrics backed with plastic foam and fabric to fabric bonded materials referred to above. The classification of returns to sub-divisions of the industry followed the standard procedure, except that returns initially classified to the sub-division 'Combers' were transferred to the sub-division 'Top makers' if the firms reported that they did not comb or re-comb tops or slubbings on their own account.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
