This Report on the Keaving of Cotton, Linen and Man-made Fibres Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in weaving fabrics, other than narrow ing glass fibre). Establishments both weaving and finishing cloth are included as well as such establishments also producing made-up household textiles: sales of finished cloth are shown in this industry but sales of made-up household textiles are included in the Report on the Made-up Household kerchiefs Industry (Part 108).
The industry corresponds to minimum list heading 413 in the Standard Industria Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry corresponds to the Weaving of Cotton, Linen and Man-made Fibres Industry (Part 77) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, except that surgical and medical dressings and sanitary towels, other than terry but including maternity pads, formerly included in this industry are no included in the Surgical bandages, etc industry (Part 42 , and woven ring and other woven elastic and el astomeric goods of widths exceeding 30 cm . formerly included in the Report on the Narrow Fabrics Industry (Part 84) are now included in this industry
Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only has been arbitrary

TREATMENT OF FINISHED CLOTH, FABRICS BACKED WITH PLASTIC FOAM AND FABRIC TO FABRIC BONDED MATERIALS
Fabrics backed with plastic foam and fabric to fabric bonded materials are shown as principal products of the same industry as the main fabric rather than the material used for the backing or bonding. Thus knitted fabrics backed with of the Report on the Hosiery and 0ther Knitted Goods Industry (Part 104) ${ }_{n}$ and the corresponding table in the Report on the Woollen and Worsted Industry (Par 101) shows sales of woollen or worsted fabrics backed with plastic foam and
woollen and worsted fabric to fabric bonded materials. Total sales of all woollen and worsted fabric to fabric bonded materials. Total sales of all
fabrics backed with plastic foam, fabric to fabric bonded materials and finished fabrics backed with plastic foam, fabric to abric of cotton, linen and man-made fibres, reported in the census, together with those reported by merchant convertors in a separate inquiry, are brought together in a supplement to Table 5 in this Report.
Sales of fabrics backed with plastic foam and fabric to fabric bonded materials were not taken into account in classifying returns to the three textile industries in which they are shown
The foambacking of fabric on commission and fabric to fabric bonding on commis sion were classified to the Textile Finishing Industry (Part 110).

METHOD OF CLASSIFICATION
The classification of returns to this industry was subject to special rules to ensure the classification of weaver/convertors and makers-up of household extiles to this industry when the combined activities were carried out within the same establishment.
Establishments were classified to this industry provided they they carried out the process of weaving and their total sales of principal products of thi industry and of the Textile Finishing Industry and/or sales of household textiles were greater than those of any other industry. In applying these rules, fabrics backed with foam and fabric to fabric bonded materials wer treated as previously described in the preceding paragraph 'Treatment of Finished C
Materials

In classifying returns to the sub-divisions of the industry, shown in Table 4 , classification was in the first instance to one of the four main groups in the industry, viz 'Finished woven cloth and made-up household textiles of cotton, man-made fibres, silk and mixtures'; 'Loom state cloth of cotton, man-made fibres, silk and mixtures'; 'Woven cloth and made-up household textiles of classif ied to the loom state cloth group were allocated to one of the three narrower sub-divisions in this group, headed 'Cotton' 'Tyre cord and fabric o man-made fibres and mixtures' and '0ther loom state cloth of man-made fibres and mixtures', if the sales of products coded to the sub-division concerned accounted for two-thirds or more of total output; the remaining returns were classified to the sub-division headed ' 0 ther and unclassified'. Returns classified to the linen and hemp group of the industry were sub-divided on a geographical basis between Great Britain and Northern Ireland
