This Report on the Mechanical Handling Equipment Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing mechanical handling equipment and parts thereof including aerial ropeways, bucket wheel reclaimers; cableways and cableway excavators; conveyors and feeders (other than underground); drag scrapers; elevators other than agricultural machinery; live storage racks; overhead runways (powered), suspension railways and telphers; pallet hoists; palletisers; pneumatic and hydraulic handling plant; portable and mobile conveyors and elevators; hoists (hydraulic, mechanical and pneumatic); stacking machines; tipplers and tippers other than for road vehicles; wagon marshalling equipment; cranes of all types including derrick cranes, dockside and gantry jib cranes, electric overhead travelling cranes, power operated mobile cranes, steelworks cranes, tower cranes and rail-mounted cranes; transporters, passenger and goods lifts; escalators and passenger conveyors; electric hoists using wire rope or chain; hand-operated chain, rope and lever hoists, pulley blocks and sheave blocks; power and handoperated travelling carriages; lifting jacks and tackle; capstans; winches and windlasses including builders' hoists; powered industrial trucks and industrial tractors including fork-lift and pallet trucks; elevating and fixed platform trucks and other industrial trucks and tractors. Colliery winding gear, conveyors for underground mines and drag line excavators are excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 337 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry corresponds to the Mechanical Handling Equipment Industry (Part 47) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, except that powered industrial trucks and industrial tractors (of the type used in factories, warehouses, railway stations and docks) complete, and parts (excluding engines), were shown in the Report on Motor Vehicle Manufacturing (Part 62). In addition the treatment of parts has been altered considerably for 1968 for this and other mechanical engineering industries. The distinction made in the 1963 reports between parts sold in association with the sale of complete machines, and other parts sold, has been discontinued for 1968 and all parts are now treated in the same way as the complete machines for classification, ie as principal products of their respective mechanical engineering industries and shown in Table 5.
Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) and to take account of the different treatment of parts adopted for 1968, so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

## METHOD OF CLASSIFICATION

In classifying returns to this industry the value of unspecified work done (other than structural and installation work), including repair work, was not taken into account unless it amounted to 80 per cent. or more of the total output of the return in which case the return was classified to General Mechanical Engineering (Part 66). The amount charged for erecting and installing machinery and plant (other than airconditioning, heating and ventilating plant) was treated as part of the selling value of these items in determining the industrial classification of returns. The standard classification procedure as outlined in the notes on page (i) was further modified where a return would have been classified to one of the mechanical engineering industries relating to a specific class of machinery (viz, Parts 50 to 66) but where the sales of the principal products of the industry concerned (including parts) accounted for less than 20 per cent. of the total output: in such cases the return was classified to the residual sub-division of the General Mechanical Engineering Industry (Part 66). The classification of returns to subdivisions of the industry, shown in Table 4, followed the standard procedure.

The sales of characteristic products shown in Table 4 include, besides the value of complete mechanical handling equipment and parts which were taken into account in classifying returns, the value of installation work.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
