MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS TRADE
THIS REPORT on the Musical Instruments Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of pianos, organs and other musical instruments. The manufacture of gramophone records is included, but the manufacture of gramophones is excluded, the latter being covered by the Radio and Telecommunications Trade.

Establishments engaged solely in repair work and tuning wore not covered by the 1937 Inquiry. Table 1, therefore, gives, as well as the full totals for 1935, figures for that year relating to the sections of the trade included in the 1937 Inquiry.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 10.3 in the Standard Industrial Classification,

Any establishments in this trade in Northern Ireland are excluded in 1948. Owing to the risk of disclosure of information relating to individual firms, separate particulars of the very small output in Northern Ireland were not published for 1935.
