## PRINTING AND PUBLISHING, BOOKBINDING, ENGRAVING, ETC

THIS REPORT on the Printing and Publishing, Bookbinding, Engraving, etc. Industries relates to establishments wholly or mainly engaged in printing, (including lithographic, photo-litho, photogravure and other methods of printing) stereotyping, engraving, bookbinding and similar kinds of work. It also covers the printing and publishing printing or publishing of newspapers amd periodicals are the subject of a separate report (Volume 10 , Industry

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 189 in the Standard Industrial Classification.
The report has been prepared in two parts: Part $\AA$ covers those establishments which are engaged in general printing work (i.e. printing, stereotyping, engraving, etc.) and includes manufacturing publishers who both publish and do their own printing: Part B is confined to those establishments which are wholly or mainly non-printing publishers of books, maps, etc

A summary table on page $10 / K / 18$ brings together the main figures for both sides of the book publishing industry (i.e. the non-printing publishers and the manufacturing publishers whose activities are covered in Part A of the report)

For published matter, publishers were asked to give the net selling value and the net advertise ment revenue: firms printing for United Kingdom publishers were required to state the net amount charged.

No production by non-printing publishers was recorded in Northern Ireland.
