## FLAX PROCESSING TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Flax Processing Trade relates to all the Government owned establishments in Great Britain operated by the Home Flax Production Directorate, either directly or through agents. There are no other establishments in this trade. All the establishments reported for the year ended July 31st.

This trade, together with the Linen and Soft Hemp Trade, corresponds to minimum list heading 115 in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Particulars are available only for 1948. Flax scutching was Particulars are avallable only for 1948 . 1935 Census, and no attempt was made to obtain information about the other processes to which raw flax is subjected (de-seeding, retting, etc.)
