HOSIERY AND OTHER KNITTED GOODS


Presented by the Board of Trade to Parliament in pursuance of the Statistics of Trade Act, 1947 ( 10 \& 11 Geo. 6 Ch. 39, Sec. 7)

THIS REPORT on the Hosiery and Other Knitted Goods Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture on machines or by hand of knitted garments and knitted fabric. Establishments that make up garments from warp-knitted fabric but do not operate knitting machines are excluded.

This report gives less detail in respect of sales than the detailed Census of Production reports for 1948 and 1951, and no distinction is made between garments made of wool, of cotton, and f other materials. More detailed information, both for 1954 and later years, is contained in the
uarterly statistics for the hosiery industry which are available from Statistics Division (K.S.). Board of Trade, Lacon House, Theobalds Road, London, W.C.1., or from the National Hosiery Manufacturers' Federation, 104, Regent Road, Leicester

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 118 in the Standard Industrial Classification.
