118 Women's and girls' tailored outerwear

This Report on the Women's and Girls' Tailored Outerwear Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing coats, costumes, skirts, slacks (excluding jeans) and other tailored garments for women and girls. The making-up of clothes cut from purchased knitted fabric is included but not the manufacture of knitted goods by establishments classified to the Hosiery and Other Knitted Goods Industry (Part 104). Retail bespoke tailoring and work-rooms attached to retail shops are excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 443 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry corresponds to the Women's and Girls' Tailored Outerwear Industry (Part 95) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, except that women's service and other uniforms and women's and girls' leather clothing formerly included in the Men's and Boys' Tailored Outerwear Industry (Part 94) are now included in this industry.

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary (apart from those included in a sample that completed a simplified version of the full census form).

Interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
