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SUMMARY TABLES

NOTES

1 This Business Monitor presents summary detail of the Census of Production for 1970, the first of the new annual series, which forms part of the new integrated system of industrial statistics being introduced by the Government Statistical Service. The complete system comprises quarterly inquiries into sales of products, annual censuses and less frequent inquiries into additional subjects, including details of purchases of goods and services by industry. It replaces the various short-period inquiries conducted by different Government departments and the detailed censuses which have been taken fairly regularly since 1907. The last detailed quinquennial census was for 1968.

These notes give the main information needed for interpreting the figures (more detailed information about the census is given in a separate booklet — 'Introductory Notes', Part C1 of the Report on the Census of Production for 1970).

2 Disclosure of information

The summary tables have been prepared in conformity with the disclosure provisions of the Statistics of Trade Act 1947. In order to avoid disclosing information about individual enterprises it has in some cases not been possible to publish information in the full detail in which it was collected.

3 Symbols used

The following symbols are used throughout:

.. Not available

- Nil or negligible (less than half the last significant figure)

* Figures cannot be shown owing to the risk of disclosing information about individual enterprises.

4 Rounding of figures

The figures in the tables have, where necessary, been rounded to the nearest final digit. There may, therefore, be apparent slight discrepancies between the sum of the constituent items and the total shown.

5 Order and higher aggregations

Where no footnote is given against an Order or higher aggregation the reader should nevertheless refer to and take into account any notes given against the industries which constitute that Order.

It should also be noted that the Order totals in columns and in rows are obtained by straightforward addition of the data therein.

6 Industrial classification

Establishments were classified to industries on the basis of major activity in conformity with the third edition of the Standard Industrial Classification (revised 1968). Normally an establishment was classified to an industry if its sales of the principal products of that industry accounted for a greater proportion of its total sales than in its sales of the principal products of any other industry. Classification of an establishment in this census was based on the establishment's return to the Census of Production, 1968.

Establishments added to the register subsequent to the 1968 census were classified on the basis of the description of the business given by the respondent.

7 Coverage

Detailed census returns were generally sought only from establishments employing on average 25 or more persons, but in industries where firms employing less than 25 persons account for a relatively high proportion of total employment and output the exemption limit was lowered to 11. Census returns were also sent to establishments whose employment was not known to the Business Statistics Office at the time of despatch; if their employment was below the exemption limit for their industry establishments were asked to supply figures only of total employment and total sales.

TERMS USED IN THE CENSUS REPORT

8 Average number employed

Establishments were required to state the number of persons on the payroll (i.e. whose national insurance cards were held by them) on the average during the year of return, whether full time or part time employees. Separate figures were required for (a) administrative, technical and clerical employees and (b) all other employees (operatives). Averages could be calculated from figures relating to the last week of each calendar month. Establishments were also required to state the number of working proprietors where appropriate and these are included in total employment figures. Outworkers (i.e. persons employed by establishments who worked in their own homes etc. on materials supplied by the establishments) are excluded.

The figures include persons engaged on merchanting or factoring and canteen workers where particulars in respect of these activities could not be excluded from the return.

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9 Working Proprietors

These include all persons regarded as "self-employed" for national insurance purposes and members of their families who worked in the business without receiving a fixed wage or salary; but such persons who worked less than half the normal number of working hours are excluded. Directors working in the business but not in receipt of a definite wage, salary or commission are included under this heading: directors paid by fee only are not included.

10 Employees

Administrative, technical and clerical employees include managing and other directors in receipt of a definite wage, salary or commission, managers, superintendents and works foremen; research, experimental development, technical and design employees (other than operatives); draughtsmen and tracers; editorial staff, staff reporters, canvassers, competition and advertising staff; travellers; and office (including works office) employees.

Operatives include all other classes of employees, that is, broadly speaking, all manual wage earners. They include those employed in and about the factory or works; operatives employed in power houses, transport work (including roundsmen), stores, warehouses, shops and canteens; inspectors, viewers and similar workers; maintenance workers, and cleaners. Operators engaged in outside work of erecting, fitting etc. are also included, but outworkers are excluded.

11 Capital expenditure

(a) New building work

This represents the cost incurred during the year of new building and other constructional work (including office buildings, canteens and the like used in connection with the business covered by the return, but not dwelling houses for employees). The value is that charged to capital account during the year of return; it includes expenditure on new buildings or on the extension or reconstruction of old buildings, the value of works of a capital nature carried out by the establishment's own staff and the cost of any newly constructed buildings purchased. Figures shown include any legal charges, stamp duties, agents' commissions, etc.

(b) Land and existing buildings

The items shown are the capital cost of freeholds purchased and the capital cost of premium payable for leaseholds acquired (excluding the value of any assets acquired in taking over an existing business), and the amounts receivable for any freeholds or leaseholds disposed of. The value is that charged to capital account during the year of return.

(c) Plant, machinery and vehicles

The items shown are the value of plant and machinery and of vehicles acquired, both new and second-hand, and the amount received for items disposed of during the year. The value of plant and machinery acquired includes plant, etc., which firms produced for their own use in connection with the business covered by the return. The value of plant, etc., acquired is the expenditure charged to capital account during the year of return less any discounts received, but including the cost of transport and installation. No deduction is made for depreciation, amortization or obsolescence. The proceeds of items disposed of during the year exclude amounts written off for items scrapped. Capital expenditure during the year in respect of manufacturing establishments where production had not started before the end of the year is excluded from the figures for both 1963 and 1968 but is included in the figures for 1970.

12 Enterprise

The term enterprise is used in this report to mean one or more establishments under common ownership or control. An enterprise normally consists of a single establishment, more than one establishment owned by the same firm, or a number of establishments owned by a parent company and its subsidiary companies. Information about the relationship between constituent companies of enterprises was obtained mainly from published sources such as the Stock Exchange Year Book supplemented by information from company reports and information supplied by establishments. The information available is not complete but covers the largest and most important groups of industrial establishments and is believed sufficient to provide a worth-while basis for analysis.

13 Establishment

The definition of the establishment differed between the Censuses for 1963, 1968 and 1970. The definitions used were as follows:-

1963: the establishment was normally the premises under the same ownership or management at a particular address.
 1968: the establishment was defined, in accordance with Standard Industrial Classification (revised 1968), as being the smallest unit which could provide the information normally required for an economic census, for example, employment, expenses, turnover and capital formation. Sometimes activities which are conducted as a single business are carried on at a number of addresses. In 1968 where the activities of such a business were closely integrated and the addresses, termed local units, were in close proximity the establishment was defined to cover the combined activities and a single return was accepted. When the activities were closely integrated but the addresses were not in close proximity a combined return was accepted but the individual addresses were treated - in the count of establishments in an industry, for instance - as separate establishments.

1970: the practice of treating as multi-unit establishments those businesses with closely integrated activities at a number of addresses in close proximity was extended to all those businesses where the local units were at more than one

geographical location and detailed census information was not available for each unit. Separate figures were obtained, however, of employment and capital expenditure at each unit. The effect of this change is to reduce some-what the number of larger establishments as compared with 1968.

14 Gross output

Gross output measures the total value of production (including work done) by establishments during the year. It is calculated as follows:-

$$\begin{aligned} &\text{Value of sales and work done} \\ \text{Plus/Less: } &\text{Increase/decrease in value of stocks of goods on hand for sale} \\ \text{Plus/Less: } &\text{Increase/decrease in value of work in progress} \\ &= \text{Gross output.} \end{aligned}$$

15 Net output

Net output represents the value added to materials by the process of production (including the margin on selling any merchanted or factored goods). It is calculated as follows:-

$$\begin{aligned} &\text{Gross output} \\ \text{Less: } &\text{Purchases adjusted for change in value of stocks of fuel and raw materials} \\ \text{Less: } &\text{Payments for work given to other establishments} \\ \text{Less: } &\text{Payments for transport} \\ \text{Less: } &\text{Net amount of any duties, subsidies, allowances and levies payable} \\ &= \text{Net output.} \end{aligned}$$

16 Net output per person employed

The figures of net output per person employed are derived by dividing the net output by the average number of persons employed (full time and part time) on all activities covered by the returns, including operatives, administrative, technical and clerical employees and working proprietors, but excluding outworkers.

17 Purchases

Purchases include the cost of materials and components bought for use in production; of fuel and electricity for all purposes; of packaging materials including the cost of returnable cases and containers when first purchased; of workshop materials, office materials and materials for repairs to establishment's own buildings, plants and vehicles when carried out by their own work people included in the returns; of consumable tools; and of parts for machinery purchased during the year as replacements. Water charges are also included. In general, purchases of goods for merchanting or factoring and canteen supplies are included. Materials supplied by customers for processing are excluded, as are all purchases charged to capital account.

The values shown include any duty paid (less rebate, etc.) but exclude trade discounts allowed. The cost of transport is included only if included in the cost of materials as invoiced; amounts paid to transport organisations, including an establishment's own separate transport organisations for delivery of materials and fuel are, therefore, excluded. Materials purchased overseas are included at the c.i.f. cost plus any duty payable if the cost of transport from the docks was not included in the invoiced price, but at their full delivery cost if invoiced "carriage pa'd home". Materials and fuel transferred from another department of the establishment not covered by the same return are included at the estimated selling value recorded by the other department.

18 Sales

Sales are in respect of goods made by the business covered by the return, goods made for it by outworkers or by other establishments from materials given out to them (sometimes described as goods made on commission) and waste products. Any machinery or other capital items produced for use in the business covered by the return are included, the value being that adopted in the establishment's asset accounts. Goods sold without being subjected to any manufacturing process (i.e. merchanted or factored) and canteen takings are included.

The value shown for sales is the net selling value, defined as the amount charged to customers whether on an ex-works or delivered basis excluding any trade discounts, agents' commissions, allowances for returnable cases, purchase tax, etc.; the net amount charged for packaging materials is included. Goods charged on a delivered basis to customers overseas are included at the f.o.b. value.

Goods produced in one establishment and transferred to another establishment of the same firm not covered by the return were treated as sales by the producing establishment and valued as far as possible as if they had been sold to an independent purchaser. Goods transferred to wholesale or retail selling organisations for which separate accounts were kept were valued on the same basis.

To the extent that sales of finished products of one establishment constitute the materials purchased by another, total figures of the value of sales (and of materials and fuel purchased) include an element of duplication. In some industries, e.g. motor vehicle manufacturing, and woollen and worsted, this duplication is substantial; and aggregates of the figures for a number of industries contain significantly greater amounts of duplication. For work done on commission, sub-

contract work, etc., the value shown is the total amount charged for the work, including the value of any materials bought and used in such work.

19 Services rendered

This represents the amounts charged for hiring out plant, machinery and other goods, providing transport, or for any technical or other services rendered to other organisations. It includes amounts credited for similar services rendered to other establishments of the same enterprise not covered by the return.

20 Standard Industrial Classification

Industry classification is based on the Standard Industrial Classification (revised 1968). It is published by H M Stationery Office together with a separate index in the form of an alphabetical list of industries.

Stocks and work in progress

Values are given of stocks of goods on hand for sale, and of materials and fuel, at the end of the year of return, including any stocks of goods held for merchanting or factoring. Values of the change during the year are also shown. The values include duty in the case of dutiable goods held out of bond.

The value of work in progress at the end of, and the change during, the year are also usually shown. This excludes any progress payments made to sub-contractors, and no deduction is made on account of progress payments received.

21 Transport payments

These represent the total amount paid or credited during the year for both outwards transport of finished goods sold and inwards transport of materials and fuel purchased. They include payment to other establishments, and to any separate transport organisation of the same establishment not covered by the return, but exclude the value of transport services provided by the business covered by the return. The items included are payments for hired cartage and for inwards and outwards carriage by all forms of inland transport, i.e. railways, road haulage, canals, coastwise shipping, air, etc. Payments made for sea and air freight on goods sold to customers overseas and on materials and fuel purchased from overseas suppliers are excluded.

22 Wages and salaries

These are amounts paid during the year to operatives and to administrative, technical and clerical employees. Payments to working proprietors, whether called salaries or not, are excluded. The values shown include all overtime payments, bonuses and commissions, whether paid regularly or not, and no deduction is made for income tax, insurances, contributory pensions, etc. The value of any payments in kind, travelling expenses, lodging allowances, etc. and employers' contributions to national insurances and pension schemes is excluded.

23 Work given out

The figures shown represent the total amount paid for work done by other establishments (whether part of the same enterprise or not) on materials supplied to them. They do not include payments to individual outworkers or payments for business and other services.

NOTES ON THE TABLES

The following paragraphs describe briefly the tables.

ESTABLISHMENT BASED TABLES

TABLE 1: NET OUTPUT AND EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY, 1963, 1968 AND 1970

This table shows the values of each of the items which are used to calculate the net output of the industry.

TABLE 2: CAPITAL EXPENDITURE, STOCKS AND WORK IN PROGRESS, 1963, 1968 AND 1970

This table shows the capital expenditure on each type of asset together with the value of each category of stocks at the end of the year (increases during the year are shown in Table 1). The 1970 figures of capital expenditure, contain estimates not yet in production, obtained in a supplementary inquiry.

TABLE 3: ANALYSIS OF ESTABLISHMENTS BY SIZE OF EMPLOYMENT, 1970

For 1970 the establishment is the reporting unit. In some cases this covers two or more locations called local units (see note 13 page iv). In this table the complete multi-unit establishment is assigned to one size group, whereas in 1968 each unit of a multi-unit return was assigned to its appropriate size group.

TABLE 4: EMPLOYMENT, NET CAPITAL EXPENDITURE AND NET OUTPUT BY COUNTRY AND STANDARD REGION, 1970

This table shows the regional distribution for each order of employment, net capital expenditure and net output. Where a return covered addresses in two or more regions an estimate was made of the net output attributable to the region only where more than 80 per cent of the establishment's employees were located in the region. The net output estimates are accompanied by comparable figures of employment expressed as a percentage of total employment in the region.

ENTERPRISE BASED TABLES

These tables relate to enterprises (see note 12 page iv). Tables 10, 11 and 12 cover enterprises employing 100 or more persons (described as 'larger enterprises'). The enterprise tables here presented entailed bringing together all the returns for the 1970 Census of Production for each enterprise that made more than one return.

Enterprises are defined here in exactly the same way as in previous parts of the Report on the Census of Production for 1970. The enterprise unit varies according to the level of analysis, e.g. at the 'all production industries private sector' level of aggregation the enterprise is made up of the establishments (or the establishment) under its ownership or control which are classified to Orders II - XIX; at the Standard Industrial Classification order level of analysis, the enterprise consists only of those establishments (or the establishment) under its ownership or control classified to the industries of that Standard Industrial Classification order; at the census industry level of analysis the enterprise consists only of those establishments (or the establishment) under its ownership or control classified to that industry. All the figures for enterprises published earlier have related to the activities of an enterprise within one or other of the 152 industries distinguished in the census.

The census covers public as well as private industrial undertakings, and these two sections are separately distinguished in Table 8.

Coal mining, Gas, Electricity and Water supply have been excluded, apart from their inclusion in the total shown for the public sector in Table 8 and in Table 9 their inclusion in the totals in their respective orders and in the totals of all industries.

TABLE 8 AND 9: ANALYSES BY SIZE OF TOTAL EMPLOYMENT, 1970

The total in each table for all enterprises corresponds to the totals for all industries in Tables 1 and 2.

TABLE 10: ANALYSIS BY SIZE OF NET OUTPUT, 1970

This table gives data for larger enterprises in the private sector analysed by the size of their total net output.

TABLE 11: ANALYSIS OF THE PRIVATE SECTOR'S 100 LARGEST ENTERPRISES DEFINED BY SIZE OF EMPLOYMENT, 1970

This table gives an industrial analysis of the data for the constituent establishments of the 100 largest enterprises by employment size.

TABLE 12: ANALYSIS OF THE PRIVATE SECTOR'S 100 LARGEST ENTERPRISES DEFINED BY SIZE OF NET OUTPUT, 1970

This table provides an analysis corresponding to that of Table 11 but for the 100 largest enterprises by net output size.

APPENDIX*Regional Classification*

The list below gives definitions of the countries of the United Kingdom and of the regions of England.

Area coding of establishments in the Census of Production, 1970 was based on areas defined by the Department of Employment. These conform to the standard regions for statistical purposes as defined by the Central Statistical Office in agreement with other Government Departments. Regions coincide with those used for economic planning, before 1 April 1974.

The boundaries of the Economic Planning Regions in England were adjusted on 1 April 1974 to take account of local government re-organisation under the Local Government Act, 1972. It has been decided that the standard regions for statistical purposes will coincide with the revised Economic Planning Regions.

As this summary volume contains data only for a year prior to the re-organisation, classification is in accord with the boundaries which existed before 1 April 1974.

Areas*North*

Cumberland, Durham, Northumberland, Westmorland, and the North Riding of Yorkshire.

Yorkshire and Humber

The East and West Ridings of Yorkshire (including City of York) and Lincolnshire (Parts of Lindsey excluding Lincoln C.B.).

East Midlands

Derbyshire (except the High Peak District, which is included in the North West Region), Leicestershire, Lincolnshire (Parts of Holland, Parts Kesteven and Lincoln C.B.), Northamptonshire (excluding the Soke of Peterborough, which is included in the East Anglia Region), Nottinghamshire and Rutland.

East Anglia

Cambridgeshire and the Isle of Ely, Huntingdonshire, Norfolk, the Soke of Peterborough and Suffolk.

South East

Bedfordshire, Berkshire, Buckinghamshire, Essex, Hampshire (including the Isle of Wight), Hertfordshire, Kent, London (Greater London Council Area), Oxfordshire, Surrey, Sussex and the Borough of Poole.

South West

Cornwall (including the Isles of Scilly), Devon, Dorset (excluding the Borough of Poole, which is included in the South East Region), Gloucestershire, Somerset and Wiltshire.

West Midlands

Herefordshire, Shropshire, Staffordshire, Warwickshire and Worcestershire.

North West

Cheshire, Lancashire and the High Peak District of Derbyshire (the Boroughs of Buxton and Glossop, the Urban Districts of New Mills and Whaley Bridge, and the Rural District of Chapel-en-le-Frith).

Wales

The whole of Wales.

Scotland

The whole of Scotland.

Northern Ireland

Antrim, Down, Armagh, Fermanagh, Tyrone, Londonderry, Belfast C.B., Londonderry C.B.

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
