## THE PACKING TRADE <br> INTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises firms whose business consisted wholly or mainly in the packing and making-up of textile goods for other firms. The term " making-up" refers, not to the putting together of finished goods, such as articles of clothing, from their materials, but to the making-up of consignments of goods in different lengths, folds or shapes, or with special tickets, tapes, parcelling, etc., as may be required for various destinations or customers.
The value of packing work carried out by manufacturing firms on their own products was included in the selling value of the products.

Tables VI and VIII are not included for this trade.
