This Report on the Narrow Fabrics Industry relates to establishments engaged
wholly or mainly in manufacturing woven, knitted or braided elastics or elastomerics not more than 30 cm . wide; ribbon, braid, tape, webbing, binding, braided bootlaces, etc other than elastic; and in weaving machinery belting of all materials on narrow looms.
This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 421 in the Standard Industrial
Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.
The industry corresponds to the Narrow Fabrics Industry (Part 84) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, except that woven and knitted lastics and elastomeric goods over 30 cm . wide formerly included in this report the Hosiery and Other Knitted Goods (Part 104) industries respectively.
Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.
