Undertakings in this trade returned their materials and fuel "purchased and used" and not "purchased" as in other trades, with the exception of coke and other by-products which were recorded on the basis of purchases. The net output in 1949 and 1948 is thus arrived at by deducting from gross output the cost of purchased materials and fuel used, including the cost of coke and other by-products purchased. In 1935 information was not obtained about the sale of appliances, and the value of new constructional work carried out by employees of gas undertakings was not included in gross and net output. Notes to Tables

- (a) Firms in this trade were not required to make returns on the basis of establishments, although a few did so.
- (b) Particulars of the small amount of work carried out by Government establishments in Northern Ireland are included in the report for private firms.
- (c) The following amounts were payable in the United Kingdom during 1949 as the employers' share of contributions to all National Insurance Schemes in respect of operatives and other workers in the trades included in this volume: Trade A (1) £9,806,000; A (2) £276,000; B £2,062,000; C £1,119,000; D £70,000; E £257,000; F £1,401,128; G £1,667,000; H (1) £286,000; H (2) £82,000.
- (d) Excluding particulars in respect of H.M. Prisons; particulars recorded for 1949 were £694,000 for the value of work done and sales, and £338,000 for the cost of materials and fuel used. The net output was £321,000. Details of wages and salaries and of persons employed are not available.
 - (e) Relates to Admiralty (Civil Engineering Department) and H.M. Office of Works establishments only.
- (f) Output was in general valued at cost, i.e. at sums calculated to cover materials used and wages and salaries paid together with the establishment charges properly attributable to the work carried out.

- (h) Owing to the risk of disclosure of information relating to individual undertakings, particulars for Northern Ireland cannot be given separately but have been included with those for England.

- (j) The proportion of the net output of the United Kingdom recorded in Northern Ireland was about 1 per cent. in Trade C and about 3 per cent. in Trade D.
- (k) Owing to the risk of disclosure of information relating to individual undertakings, particulars for Wales cannot be given separately but have been included with those for England.
- (l) Owing to the risk of disclosure of information relating to individual undertakings, particulars for Wales and Northern Ireland cannot be given separately but have been included with those for England.
 - (m) Not ascertained in 1948 and 1935.
- (n) Undertakings employing on average more than 10 persons include for 1949 all gas works, regardless of size, of the Area Gas Boards together with the larger non-nationalized undertakings. The 1949 figures for undertakings employing on average 10 or fewer persons relate only to the smaller non-nationalized undertakings. This is the reason for the fall shown in the number of small undertakings and the increase in the number of gasworks of the larger undertakings compared with previous years. Three larger non-nationalized undertakings are included, all in England.
- (o) Including the value of work of repair and maintenance of buildings, plant and machinery carried out by the employees of the undertaking.
- (p) Including railway sidings and meters.
- (q) Including the following amounts returned as plant and machinery (including buildings) where the buildings could not be separately evaluated: England, £2,792,000; Wales, £220,000; Scotland, £85,000.
- (r) The figures for disposals represent the proceeds from sale of appliances formerly on hire that were sold without being renovated, plus the written down value of those sold after reconditioning.

Undertakings employing on average 10 or fewer persons cover the small non-nationalized undertakings only. Nineteen larger non-nationalized undertakings are included for Great Britain (16 in England and 3 in Scotland) in 1949 and 20 in 1948.

(2) Firms employing between 11 and 24 persons were not required to furnish separate country particulars and it has been assumed that the work done by them is carried out in the country in which the firm is located. Separate country particulars cannot therefore be shown for a number of headings in the table for which the information is available only for Great Britain as a whole.
- The country information obtained under (1) above was broken down by firms making returns among the seventeen industrial areas of Great Britain and this information is shown in Table 1-A (3) on page 12/4.
