- 1 This index includes an A to Z subject index for the year, and subject or chronological listings for each section of the journal. In addition, there is a listing of articles that have been published from 1999 to 2002. There is also an alphabetical list of article authors.
- 2 The A to Z subject index covers the whole of the journal apart from the labour market data appearing in the pink pages, which are in standard form each month, and the Labour Market Spotlight section. It therefore includes references not only to main features but also to Parliamentary Questions, news reports and research briefs.
- 3 *Labour Market Trends* replaced *Employment Gazette* in November 1995 when the Central Statistics Office (CSO) took over from the Department of Employment responsibility for publishing statistics on the labour market. In April 1996 the CSO merged with the Office of Population Censuses and Surveys to form the Office for National Statistics (ONS). *Labour Market Trends* is available to download free of charge on the National Statistics website.
