



## Shipbuilding and ship repairing trade

THIS REPORT on the Shipbuilding and Ship Repairing Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the building or repairing of ships. boats, barges. lighters, etc. of all types and sizes, whether self-propelled or not.
