GENERAL INFORMATION
Changes in the 1963 census
There were few changes resulting from amendments to the Standard Industrial Classif ication and only minor changes in the scope of certain
industry reports compared with 1958. Any such industry reports compare whe in introduct ions to
changes are explained in the in
the industry reports concerned or by footnotes the industry r
to the tables.
Industrial Classification
Establishments were classified to industries on the basis of major activity in conformity with
the second edition of the Standard Industrial the seconc edit ion of the Standard Industr
Classificat ion (Consolidated Edition 1963, incorporat ing Amendment 1). Each industry was
basically def ined in terms of its principal basically detine in terms of its principal
products, these being of a similar nature or commonty associated in production. Normally, an establishment was classified to an industry
if its sales of the principal products of that industry accounted for a greater proportion its total sales than did its sales of the principal products of any other industry. How-
ever, where the application of this rule would have resulted in a change of classification between 1958 and 1963 , the establishment wa
reclassified only if the sales of principal reclassified only if the sales of principal
products of the newly predominant industry more than one third greater than the sales of
principal products of the previously predominat principal products of the previously predominant
industry. This modification of the general rule was introduced for 1958 to avoid discontinuities which would result from marginal changes in sales between successive censuses
The principle of classification by major output was also normally followed in compiling
the analysis by sub-divisions of an industry. the analysis by sub-divisions of an industry.
In certain industries, classification was dealt with in a different way. Details of any non-standard treatment are given in the intro-

Capital Expenditure
(i) New building work. This represents the cost incurred during

This Report on the Railway Carriages, Wagons and Trams Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing and repairing railway coaches (including those embodying motive units), wagons, trucks, brake
boxes, etc.; tramcars; and colliery and other trams and tubs, etc.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 385 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Consolidated edition, 1963).

With certain exceptions, as shown in the List of Tables, the tables in this report are in two parts. Part A relates to rail way workhops and Part $B$ to other manufacturers. Returns in full detail were obtained for all railway

The output of railway workshops is valued at cost, i.e., a sum calculated to cover the cost of labour and materials together with such a proportion of the general establishment charges properly applicable to the output concerned but without any allowance for profit. The output of other manufacturers is, however

There were no establishments in this industry in Northern Ireland in 1954, 1958 or 1963.
