General footnotes

- (a) Import Duty Inquiries were held for the years 1933, 1934, 1937 and 1938 under the Import Duties Act (1932) but the 1938 inquiry concerned only six trades, the results of which were never compiled. The scope of the inquiries differed from the censuses of production, some trades not being covered and others only partially, but comparative figures for the 1930 and 1935 censuses have been included for the trades shown. Unlike the trades shown in Table 1 trades could not be reclassified in accordance with the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) but have been compiled from the census of production reports published for 1935 and 1951. There has been however, some revision of 1935 figures to accord with the introduction of the SIC in 1948. For this reason also it has been necessary to show some trades grouped to SIC Order level rather than for individual trades. The results of the 1946 partial census of production have also been included along with the comparative 1948 census figures.
- (b) For 1948 the figures relate to Great Britain only.
- (c) Order and industry numerals are as described in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) but the coverage of the industries shown relates to the inquiries.
- (d) For 1930 the figures relate to Great Britain only.
- (e) For 1933, particulars of certain important firms in biscuit manufacturing are excluded, the employment of which in 1934 amounted to 1,659 persons, with a gross output of £718,000.
- (f) The figures from 1930 to 1934 exclude departments of certain firms engaged in the production of condensed milk for use in their own works. For all years manufacturers of ice cream are excluded.
- (g) Ice producers and fish curers are excluded from all the inquiries and establishments mainly engaged in flour blending from the 1937 inquiry.
- (h) From 1930 to 1934 establishments mainly engaged in the manufacture of animal oils and greases, and for 1935 and 1937, animal (other than marine) oils and greases and lard are excluded, but are included in the lubricating oils and greases industry MLH 263.
- (i) Excluding output at mineral oil refineries but from 1930 to 1934 including establishments mainly engaged in the manufacture of animal oils and greases and for 1935 and 1937 animal (other than marine) oils and greases.
- (j) Excluding establishments mainly engaged in the manufacture of matches and Ordnance Factories producing explosives and ammunition.
- (k) Including payments to other organisations for work done on materials given out.
- (i) Excluding all establishments engaged solely in the work of repairing, reconditioning and installation, except for 1946 and 1948. Including Government Departments for 1948 which were excluded for other years. Constructional engineering was not collected for 1937 nor the small error industry for 1946.
- (m) Described as watches and clocks and scientific, surgical and photographic instruments, etc. Excluding establishments mainly engaged in repair work.
- (n) Private firms (excluding Railway Companies and other Public Utility Services and firms whose business was confined to repair work). For 1935 and 1937 tramway undertakings are also excluded.
- (o) Establishments mainly engaged in the manufacture of engineers' small tools and gauges are included from 1930 to 1934 but excluded for 1935 and 1937. Establishments engaged solely in refining precious metals are also excluded for 1937.
- (p) Wool merchants mainly engaged in the sorting, blending and scouring of wool are excluded from 1930 to 1934 and also firms mainly engaged in lace finishing. Establishments mainly engaged in the repair and reconditioning of purchased sacks are excluded for 1930, 1934 and 1937 and establishments maintained by Railway Companies for making-up and repairing tarpaulins, wagon covers, etc. are excluded for all years.
- q) From 1930 to 1934 excluding establishments mainly engaged in millinery manufacture, included in the figures for tailoring, dressmaking, etc.
- (r) For the years 1930 to 1934 including establishments mainly engaged in millinery manufacture. Retail bespoke tailoring and dressmaking workrooms attached to retail shops are included for 1946 and 1948.
- (s) From 1930 to 1934 establishments mainly engaged in the manufacture of fur gloves are excluded.
- (t) Excluding for 1933 establishments that were not paper manufacturers but were mainly engaged in processing purchased paper (e.g. water-proofing, coating, etc.).
- (u) Including work done by private firms employing eleven or more persons, Government Departments and Local Authorities in Great Britain, other than by firms classified to Gas, Electricity, Water Supply, Railways (Civil Engineering), Tram, Trolleybus and Omnibus Undertakings (Civil Engineering) and Canal, Dock and Harbour Undertakings (Civil Engineering) industries.
