## THE TEXTILE FINISHING TRADE

## INTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises firms that were engaged wholly or mainly in the bleaching, dyeing, printing and finishing of all textile products, including lace goods.

Table VIII relating to exports and imports is not included for this trade.
