## THE HOSIERY TRADE

#### INTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises firms that were engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of stockings and socks, knitted underwear, fancy hosiery, knitted gloves, knitted neckties and knitted fabric. making-up clothing from purchased knitted fabric were classified in the Clothing Trades (see the Tailoring, Dressmaking, etc., Trades (page 402) and the Glove Trade (page 473)).
